During the training we've handled topics like; networking, product pricing, customer care, environment and business, bookkeeping and so much more. Also during the breaks we told them to be discussing and encourage each other.

The group had a nice mix between young and old, women and men all with different businesses. I believe that this helps, because the teaching that was done was basic and could be applied into any type of business. Also they were able to give each other examples from their own field of expertise. We could not have done this training or any of the previous trainings if it wasn't for some of your donations. These trainings are not expensive because of our partnership with the Ministry of Trade, but I wouldn't be able to pay it all myself.

Mr. Obago's farm is also doing great, right now he is waiting for another mango harvest. But in the meantime he is also growing tomatoes and spinach on his new plot. Mr. Obago normally sells grafted mango tree seedlings, but the grafting went wrong and now he lost a lot of seedlings.
