## Mbita Farm

I have mentioned something about our farm before on Facebook and we also have it posted now on our website. But I wanted to bring it to your attention again in our update.

Dare To Dream is all about empowering families through business training, micro loans and mentorship. We do this so that they can be self-sustainable, so that they are able to take care of those in need. Like the orphans.

Dare To Dream has been relying on donations from overseas. But this is something that I have found personally to be one of the hardest things about doing this work. I believe in giving and living a life of generosity, and blessing people around you. But I also believe in working hard and doing what you can.

I have always been looking for ways to make Dare To Dream a bit more self-sustainable. And now finally I have



found a way we can start doing that. We are starting a farm, not a farm with animals or anything, but we are going to grow onions and beans.

In Kenya there is always a demand for onions and beans. We have leased a piece of land from a widow in our community and have plowed the field. We then divided the land into 3 sections where we will start to do crop rotation. With the help of [Bejo Zaden Nederland](#) we received high quality onion seeds, which will be planted first.

We are planning on selling a high quality product at normal market prices and with the profit, we will start sustaining the project. Our goal would be that the program will eventually be locally funded by 75% and 25% from outside sources.

The farm we will be hiring a local and give him or her a full-time job. The proceeds of the farm will be funding a large part of Dare To Dream Mbita.

## Loans

In the 3 months that I've been out of Kenya, the program continued, including the loans. We still have 10 active loans running. In my absence we were able to give out 1 new loan because of the repayments of the other loans. This was another great reminder that the money that was donated to one person is now serving several people.

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
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### 3 Year Mark
